Student Wellbeing

Students in Years 5 and 6 are participating in a new initiative being offered by Catholic Education SA in conjunction with professors from the Flinders University. The P.E.A.C.E (Preparation, Education, Action, Coping and Evaluation) Pack program is designed to reduce bullying in our schools. "It is an intervention program addressing bullying in schools and presents school-based strategies that have been shown to reduce school bullying (Slee, PT 2017)."

It has been implemented in over 40 schools in Australia and has been translated to be used in other countries.

The students filled in a pre-survey and will complete a further survey in Term 3 once classes have completed the series of lessons.

Students in the middle and senior classes have recently also completed a school generated online survey to identify factors that impact on their wellbeing whilst at school. We look forward to analyzing the responses and identify areas that need to be addressed to ensure that we can fulfill our commitment to ensuring that every child feels safe, valued and connected!

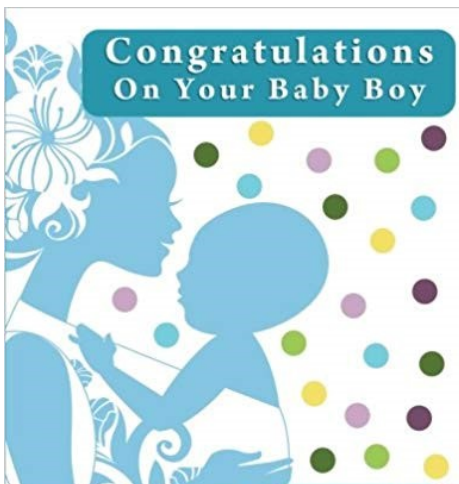

Jack Buckskin for welcoming us to country and teaching us aboriginal songs, language and respect for his spirituality.

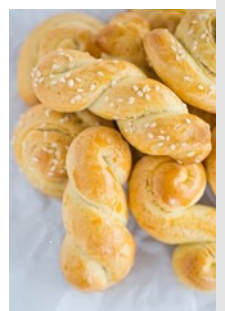

Week 9 at Preschool June 2019

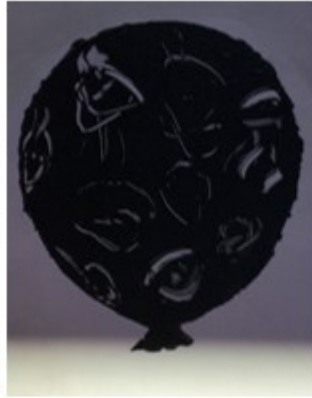

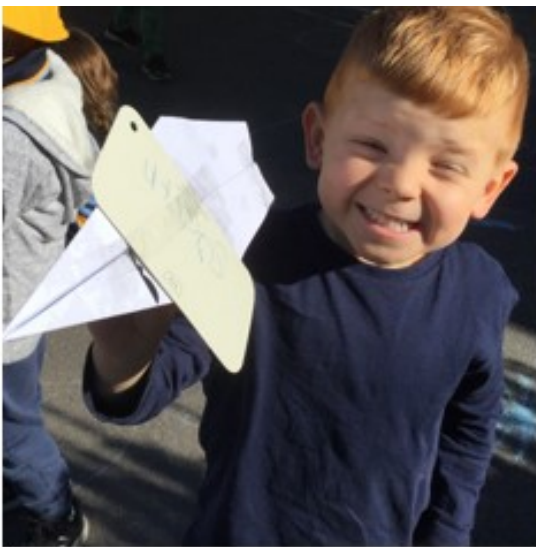
In our differences there are many similarities and we acknowledge the rich diversity of our community.

St Joseph's Hindmarsh is providing an opportunity for your child to participate in ICAS Assessments in the areas of English, Mathematics, Science, Digital Technologies, Spelling and Writing, offered through the University of New South Wales. ICAS is an independent, quality skills-based assessment program, held at school and supervised by teachers under normal examination conditions following guidelines provided, to ensure that the same conditions are afforded to all students worldwide. Assessments, marking and issuing of awards are the responsibility of ICAS.

This year, the assessments will be offered 'online' with the exception of Yr 3 & 4 Writing, which will remain as a paper assessment.

As students will be participating 'online' they will need access to either their own device or a school device, as well as, feel confident in navigating the computer. With the assessments going 'online' the assessment timeline is over a three week period in Term Three.

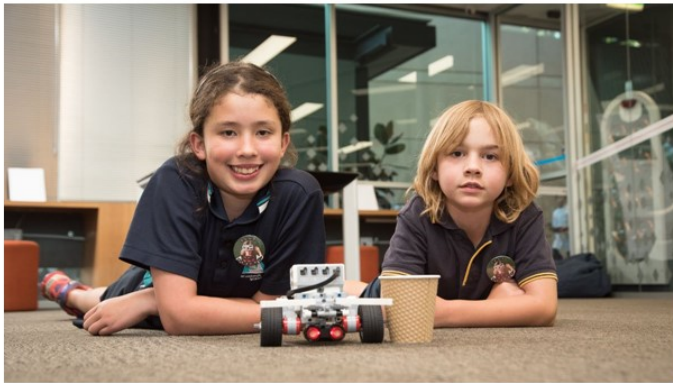
Imagine Inspire Ignite

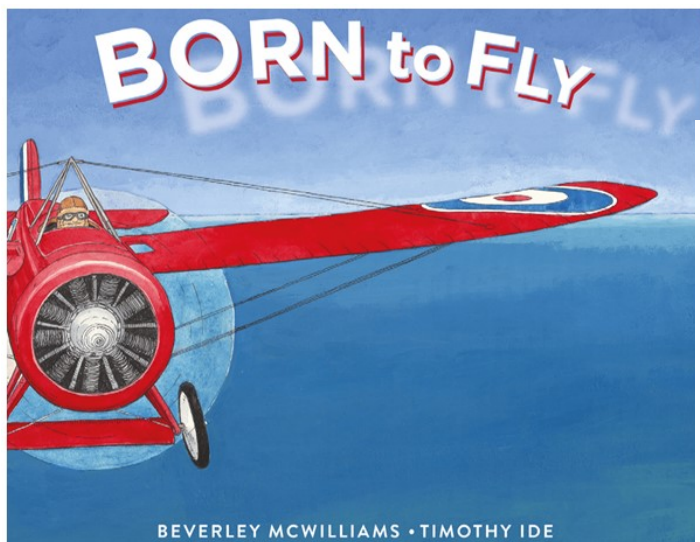
