St Joseph's School Feast Day

Yesterday we celebrated the feast day of St Joseph. Joseph was Jesus' foster father and the patron saint of the Sisters of St Joseph who founded our school. The little we know about St Joseph is found in the Gospels where he is shown to be a humble, caring, compassionate man who, along with Mary, parented Jesus to be a faithful and loving man who undoubtedly changed the world as he knew it. We marked the feast day of St Joseph with a wonderful Mass led by our Year 4 and 5 students in Miss O'Neil's class.

Strength Switch Parenting Course

A small number of our families took advantage of this wonderful opportunity over the past few weeks to learn more about how to take a strengthbased approach to parenting. Presented by Courtney Quigley and based upon Professor Lea Waters book, 'The Strength Switch', this course supported our families to build and apply the same understandings that our students are exploring through the Visible Wellbeing framework over the past year. Uniform Update

Over the past months, we have been working with Alinta Uniforms to take over production and trade of our school uniform. Alinta, who can be found at 383 Grange Road Findon, will begin trade of our uniform from Monday 14 April. Our current provider, Vinnies at Croydon, will cease trade of our uniform on Friday 28 March 2025. This will allow two weeks for the remaining stock to change hands and be prepared for sale at Alinta. Please note, there will be no sales of our uniform for approximately two weeks between these dates.

Whilst our uniform will largely remain the same, Alinta have been working on improving cut, look and fabric of our pieces. This will mean that new stock sold from their store will have some subtle differences from current stock. This is not a uniform change and, therefore, there is no expectation that families will need to purchase new pieces within a time frame. This need only occur as your existing uniform pieces become too small or worn out. Alinta will also supply school bags, hats, hair accessories and socks. A price list will be shared with families when these details are finalised, however, you will notice that the prices largely remain the same, with only some small changes as necessary to accommodate the improved fabric.

Hats

I have recently noticed a small number of students wearing non-school hats or with no hat. Please ensure your child has a St Joseph's School hat at school every day. These are still available to purchase at the Vinnies store until cease of trade on March 28.

Throughout Lent we will be raising money for Caritas Australia's Project Compassion. This began with a gold coin donation on Shrove Tuesday.



By recognising our thoughts and understanding that they come and go, students are learning how to manage their emotions and build healthy coping strategies.




Exciting New Whole-School Approach to Mathematics!
